

Critical Incidents Reported to Manitoba Health

Period: October 01, 2019 - December 31, 2019

| Fiscal Year Occurred | Degree of Injury | Description |
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| 2019/20 | Major | A patient with signs of a serious complication required a diagnostic test that was not completed. |
| 2019/20 | Major | The patient suffered a significant device-related skin injury while in hospital. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A client swallowed an inedible substance that was not secured and required critical care intervention. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A patient experienced a fall with injury. Post fall assessments were not consistently completed leading to a delay in identifying and treating a serious medical condition. |
| 2019/20 | Death | Blood test results indicated a decline in kidney function. Resident passed away 10 days later. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A patient, on close observation, left the hospital and experienced harm. The opportunity to activate all patient search protocols was not realized. |
| 2019/20 | Major | During a medical procedure a patient experienced an acute deterioration that was not immediately recognized leading to a delay in providing treatment. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A resident developed a pressure related skin injury. Strategies to decrease the risk of injury were not initiated. |
| 2019/20 | Death | There was a delay in recognition and response to a life threatening illness and a subsequent delay in patient transfer to a critical care bed. |
| 2019/20 | Death | Client presented to ER with complaints of dizziness and fainting. While waiting for further assessment the client experienced cardiac arrest in the emergency room. Client deceased. |
| 2019/20 | Death | A patient experienced an acute change in their medical condition that required intervention. There were delays in recognizing the change in the patient's condition and in moving the patient to a critical care environment. |
| 2019/20 | Death | A patient experienced a delay in surgery which led to a decline in their condition and transfer to a higher level of care. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A patient developed a pressure related skin injury. Strategies to decrease the risk of injury were not initiated. |
| 2019/20 | Death | An individual suffered serious injuries off-site and later died in hospital. |
| 2019/20 | Suicide | Patient on an approved leave did not return to hospital. Patient found deceased |

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| 2019/20 | Major | There was a delay in the recognition and treatment of a serious infection resulting in an unplanned admission to hospital and additional complications. |
| 2019/20 | Major | Patient developed blood clots in both lungs while in care. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A patient underwent an outpatient diagnostic test that included a medication that was contraindicated based on the patient's medical history resulting in a serious complication and admission to hospital. |
| 2019/20 | Major | Patient developed a Stage 3 Pressure Injury while an inpatient on Acute Care unit. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A patient with acute injuries experienced a delay in transfer to a higher level of care and specialist services. The delay contributed to long term disabilities for this patient. |
| 2019/20 | Death | The patient was found by a psychiatric nursing assistant, without a pulse on their bed in the female dormitory at 0918 hours. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A patient was given incorrect medications. As a result, the patient required transfer to a higher level of care. |
| 2019/20 | Major | Opportunities for investigation and treatment of a medical condition were not realized. As a result, the patient's condition deteriorated requiring transfer to a higher level of care. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A patient was discharged without community and family supports resulting in patient deterioration and readmission to hospital. |
| 2019/20 | Major | Patient developed a Stage 3-4 Pressure Injury while an inpatient on a mixed bed Acute Care unit. |
| 2019/20 | Major | Resident fell out of bed and suffered a nasal fracture, cartilage injury, and facial lacerations requiring 20 stitches after fall mat was removed and resident was left unattended. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A patient's condition deteriorated. There was a missed opportunity to recognize the deterioration and provide timely transfer to a higher level of care. |
| 2019/20 | Major | There was a delay in restarting a patient's medication after a procedure. The delay led to an extension of the patient's hospital stay. |
| 2019/20 | Major | The patient experienced a delay in the treatment of a life threatening infection resulting in an acute deterioration with emergent intervention and transfer to a higher level of care. |
| 2019/20 | Death | A pregnant client was admitted to the facility due to pain and spotting. Labour was induced and the client gave birth, however the fetus did not survive. A critical incident review is being undertaken to gain a better understanding of this event. |
| 2019/20 | Major | There was a delay in recognition and intervention for acute changes in a patient's condition. The patient required transfer to a higher level of care and an extended hospitalization. |
| 2019/20 | Major | A patient required medical treatment and transfer to a higher level of care after possibly ingesting a harmful substance found in the care environment. |

Death

A patient sought care at multiple sites. The opportunity for communication between care providers and continuity of care was not consistently realized.
