Mr. MALOWAY - Minister of Health to put an end to the centralization and privatization of Winnipeg hospital food services (K. Moore, D.V. Boboski, C. Champagne and others)

Hon. Mr. PITURA, the Minister of Government Services, made a statement regarding World Red Cross Day being celebrated on May 8, 1998,

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Hon. Mr. CUMMINGS, the Minister of Natural Resources, made a statement regarding National Forest Week, May 3-8, 1998,

By leave, Hon. Mrs. McINTOSH introduced Bill (No. 53) - The Apprenticeship and Trades Qualifications Act; Loi sur l'apprentissage et la qualification professionnelle, which was read a First Time.

Hon. Mrs. McINTOSH presented:

Message from His Honour, the Lieutenant Governor recommending the disposition of public revenue for Bill (No. 53).

The debate was, on motion of Mr. REID, adjourned.

By unanimous consent, the sequence for consideration of estimates, as outlined in Sessional Paper No. 142 tabled on March 24, 1998, and subsequently amended, was further amended in order that the consideration of the estimates of the Department of Health scheduled for consideration in Room 255, be set aside and that following the completion of the consideration of the estimates of the Department of Northern Affairs in Room 255, consideration of the estimates of the Department of Industry, Trade and Tourism commence and be continued until further advised.
