ABORIGINAL AND NORTHERN AFFAIRS OPERATIONS \$20,382,500.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2002.

19.3 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding THREE MILLION, ONE HUNDRED NINETY-THREE THOUSAND, THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS for ABORIGINAL AND NORTHERN AFFAIRS:

CAPITAL GRANTS..... \$3,193,300.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2002.

19.4 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS for ABORIGINAL AND NORTHERN AFFAIRS:

AMORTIZATION OF CAPITAL ASSETS..... \$135,000.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2002.
