PRAYER AND LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

1:30 O'CLOCK P.M.

By leave, the House agreed to the following provisions:

1. For the Speaker to dispense with calling Introduction of Bills, Committee Reports, Tabling of Reports and Ministerial Statements today.
2. To have only one Member's statement today, with the understanding that the Official Opposition will use their two statements from today sometime later this session.
3. To waive the two-minute time limit on a Member's statement delivered today by the Honourable Member for Waverley.
4. For the House to observe a moment of silence after the statement.
5. For the House to recess for up to 30 minutes following the statement by the Honourable Member for Waverley, with a two-minute bell to summon Members at the end of the recess. As part of this agreement, the House must resume by 2:30 at the latest.
