HON. GURNEY EVANS (Minister of Industry and Commerce) (Fort Rouge): Madam Speaker, before you proceed with the Orders, I would like to lay on the Table of the House, a supplemental Return to an Order of the House No. 27, dated March 14, 1966, on the motion of the Leader of the NDP Party.

MR. RUSSELL PAULLEY (Leader of the New Democratic Party) (Radisson): Madam Speaker, before the Orders of the Day, I would like to direct a question to the Honourable the Minister of Education in the absence of the First Minister. A committee known as the Citizens Committee of Windsor and Niakwa Park has forwarded one or two letters to the First Minister, and I believe carbon copies to the Honourable the Minister of Education, in respect of the construction of a school in the Windsor Park area, and I am informed that they have not as yet received replies from the First Minister or the Minister of Education in respect of this matter. I'm wondering if my honourable friend the Minister of Education might indicate, on behalf of the First Minister, when replies might be received by the committee. One was a brief; the other was a letter following the brief.

HON. GEORGE JOHNSON (Minister of Education) (Gimli): Madam Speaker, I'd like to take this as notice if I may and check into it.

MR. PAULLEY: I apologize, Madam Speaker, for not telling my honourable friend. This has just come to my notice.

MR. LAURENT DESJARDINS (St. Boniface): Madam Speaker, before the Orders of the Day, I wonder if I can ask the Leader of this House if it's expecting too much to have an answer before the end of this Session, to have an answer to my Orders of Return asking for the different boards and commissions established, the same question I put in last year during the Session.

MR. EVANS: I'm not sure that I caught which item it was.

MR. DESJARDINS: It was the Order for Return dealing with the different boards and commissions and the personnel and salaries and so on.

MR. EVANS: The only information I have for my honourable friend is the same answer the Premier gave the day that he had asked all the Ministers to hasten in their returns. Now I have no knowledge of the particular Order about which you enquire. I will make a special enquiry with respect to that and see what can be done.

Madam Speaker, I beg to move, seconded by the Honourable the Attorney-General, that the House do now adjourn and stand adjourned until 9:30 tomorrow morning.

MADAM SPEAKER presented the motion and after a voice vote declared the motion carried and the House adjourned until 9:30 Friday morning.
