Community Overview

History

The community of Moose Lake is located adjacent to the Mosakahiken Cree Nation reserve. Information relates to the non-reserve side, unless otherwise noted.

Access

The community is located on the northern limits of the Saskatchewan River Delta on the western shore of Cedar Lake 74 kilometres southeast of The Pas.

Governance

The community is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

The Saskatchewan River Delta and adjoining Cedar Lake provide intensive fishing and wildlife production. Cattle ranching has been practised in the past. Commercial fishing provides substantial income with fish transported to The Pas. Trapping provides additional income and wild rice has been planted on nearby lakes. Presently, the most notable activity has been through the Moose Lake Loggers. Local residents as well as residents from nearby communities of Cormorant, Cranberry Portage and The Pas are employed.
