SUN LINE LTD.: "the Licencee"

for the storage and use of used oil as a fuel for the heating and drying of aggregate at a permanent asphalt plant in the production of asphalt, located at 175 Pacific Street in Winkler, Manitoba, and in accordance with the proposal filed under The Dangerous Goods Handling and Transportation Act on June 20, 2005, and subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

DEFINITIONS

In this Licence,

"**accredited laboratory**" means facilities accredited by the Standard Council of Canada (SCC), or facilities accredited by another accrediting agency recognized by Manitoba Conservation to be equivalent to the SCC, or facilities which can demonstrate to Manitoba Conservation, upon request, that quality assurance/quality control (QA/QC) procedures are in place equivalent to accreditation based on the Canadian Standard Can/CSA-Z753, extension of the international standard ISO 9000, Guide 25;

"**Director**" means an employee of the Department who has been designated or appointed by the Minister;

"**Environment Officer**" means a department employee so designated or appointed by the minister;

"**facility**" means the used oil storage tanks and all other equipment associated with the handling of used oil;

****A COPY OF THE LICENCE MUST BE KEPT ON SITE AT THE DEVELOPMENT AT ALL TIMES****

"oil" means any petroleum or synthetic crankcase oil, engine oil, hydraulic fluid, transmission fluid, gear oil, heat transfer fluid, or other fluid capable of use for lubricating purposes in machinery or equipment;

"used oil" means oil that through use, storage, handling, defect, damage, expiry of shelf life or other similar circumstances can no longer be used for its original purpose;

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The Licencee shall implement a high standard of equipment maintenance, good housekeeping and operational practices at the facility consistent with the requirements of this Licence.
2. The Licencee shall provide to the Director, upon request, all information required under this Licence, in writing and in such form and content (including number of copies), as may be specified by the Director.
3. The Licencee shall train all personnel handling dangerous goods as required by the Federal Transport of Dangerous Goods Regulation and all training documentation shall be available at the facility for review by an Environment Officer
4. The Licencee shall only receive used oil from the licenced facility at 460 George Avenue in Winkler or another source if approved by the Director.
5. The Licencee shall notify the Director of an intended alteration of process, which may effect in any manner a waste discharge or emission, prior to implementing such alteration.


SPECIFICATION, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

6. The Licencee shall only use storage tanks for the used oil that are ULC approved or constructed, installed and operated in compliance with Manitoba Regulation 188/2001.
7. The Licencee shall visually inspect all storage tanks and spill containment systems for leakage on a weekly schedule and all inspections are to be recorded in a log book.
8. The Licencee shall maintain and keep available on-site for inspection by an Environment Officer, a daily log of information respecting all used oils received and stored at the facility, including, but not limited to, information on the origin, the analysis and volume of each shipment.
9. The Licencee shall, unless otherwise specified by this Licence, retain all records during the full life of operation of the facility, and after closure, for such period of time as may be specified by the Director. Records may be transferred from their original form to other accepted forms for information storage.

10. The Licencee shall forward to the Director, within 30 days of a request by the Director for the information, the reports containing the information prescribed in Clause 8 of this Licence.
11. The Licencee shall ensure that whenever used oils are being transferred, the transfer is supervised by trained personnel at all times and in such a manner that the flow of used oils can be immediately shut off, if necessary.
12. The Licencee shall:
 - (a) only burn used oil in the burner system of the aggregate dryer; and
 - (b) only burn used oil where the flash point of the used oil is greater than 65°C.
13. The Licencee shall properly equip the facility with all necessary spill cleanup equipment and supplies.
14. The Licencee shall immediately report all spills of used oil, or other hazardous wastes in excess of 100 litres at the facility to the 24 hour emergency response line at Manitoba Conservation at (204) 944-4888.
15. The Licencee shall report within one working day all spills of used oil, or other hazardous wastes in excess of 5 litres, but less than 100 litres, at the facility to the Winkler Office of Manitoba Conservation at (204) 325-1750.
16. The Licencee shall contain and clean up immediately any chemical spills in order to prevent soil, surface water or ground water contamination.
17. The Licencee shall immediately dispose of any contaminated material in accordance methods approved by an Environment Officer.
18. The Licencee shall, upon the written request of the Director, sample the used oil and have the sample analysed at an accredited laboratory for the following parameters:
 - i) arsenic;
 - ii) cadmium;
 - iii) chromium;
 - iv) lead;
 - v) total organic halogens; andany other parameters specified by the Director.
19. The Licencee shall provide the results of the analysis carried out pursuant to Clause 18 to the Director within 60 days of the sampling.

REVIEW AND REVOCATION

- A. If, in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding or has or is failing to meet the specifications, limits, terms, or conditions set out in this Licence, the Director may, temporarily or permanently, revoke this Licence.
- B. If, in the opinion of the Director, new evidence warrants a change in the specifications, limits, terms or conditions of this Licence, the Director may require the filing of a new proposal pursuant to The Dangerous Goods Handling and Transportation Act.
