In accordance with the Manitoba Environment Act (C.C.S.M. c. E125)

THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

Public Works Canada: "the Licencee"

for the construction and maintenance of the Development being the reconstruction of the west approach to the PTH #44 bridge over the St. Andrews Lock and Dam on the Red River at Lockport. The Development consists of the construction of two spans of drive through truss bridge connecting the west roadway embankment with the existing bridge over the St. Andrews Dam. The Development is subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

Specifications, Limits, Terms and Conditions

- 1) The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with methods outlined in the Environment Act Proposal dated January 28, 1993, and the accompanying reports "Initial Environmental Assessment Proposed Demolition/Reconstruction of the West Approach to St. Andrews Lock and Dam, Lockport, Manitoba" and "Background Information for Environmental Assessments on Proposed Rehabilitation of the St. Andrews Lock and Dam, Lockport, Manitoba".
- 2) The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, clean up and deposit all debris from the construction site at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to *Manitoba Regulation 150/91R* respecting *Waste Disposal Grounds*.
- 3) The Licencee shall ensure that all debris resulting from site preparation is removed from the banks and ice surface of the Red River prior to the breakup of the ice surface in the spring of 1993.
- 4) The Licencee shall submit, not later than June 30, 1993, an emergency spill / response plan for the project for the approval of the Director.
- 5) The Licencee shall ensure that all waste oil products generated by the machinery used in the construction of the Development are collected and disposed of in accordance with applicable Manitoba Environment and legislation requirements.

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Revocation

If, in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the specifications, limits, terms or conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke this Licence either temporarily or permanently.
