

## Notice of Environment Act Proposal

Manitoba Conservation has received a proposal pursuant to The Environment Act from the following operation and invites public participation in the review process:

### **ROBERT AND MARGARET RETTIE - RETTIE BOAT ACCESS (FILE: 5486.00)**

An Environment Act Proposal has been filed by Robert and Margaret Rettie for the Rettie Boat Access project in SE 16-17-7E near Beaconia. The project involves the construction of a canal for private boat access from the Beaconia Marsh near the north end of the property to a boat launch and docking area near the south end of the property. The canal was constructed during the winter of 2009/2010 and is approximately 500 metres long, 8 metres wide and 2 metres deep; the boat launch and docking facilities as well as the stabilization of disturbed soil remain to be completed.
